MESSAGE FROM THE PC FAMILY

2024 has been a year of immense suffering for the Palestinian people. The genocide and relentless aggression against our people have left deep scars, taking countless innocent lives and devastating our communities. As a team, we have not been untouched by this pain. We continue to deeply miss our colleague, Mohamad Abu Sakha, who has been unjustly kidnapped by the Israeli occupation since June 2023 ,9, under the illegal practice of administrative detention. His absence is felt every day, and we remain steadfast in demanding his immediate release.

Despite these hardships, our commitment to our mission has never wavered. The Palestinian Circus, through the dedication of our team, artists, trainers, board of directors, general assembly, and our partners and supporters has worked tirelessly to bring hope to children, youth, and communities across the West Bank, Jerusalem, and Gaza. Through circus, we have created spaces of resilience, joy, and resistance—offering Palestinian children and youth a moment of relief and a means to express their strength in the face of oppression.

In every performance, workshop, and initiative, we have seen the power of art to inspire and uplift. In a time when our people are enduring so much pain, we remain committed to using circus as a tool of hope, resistance, and unity.

We extend our deepest gratitude to all those who have stood by us, supported our work, and amplified our voices. The struggle continues, and so does our commitment to life, freedom, and justice.






3 - Month Specialized Workshops

The 3-month specialized workshops are designed for children between the ages of 5 and 9, aiming to familiarize them with the basics of acrobatics, juggling, and aerial disciplines. In this program, we engage with youngsters to foster self-discovery and promote social change.

PC trained 65 students during the first semester (from January to May 2024), and 138 students during the second semester (from September to December 2024) in Birzeit, Jenin (in cooperation with the Freedom Theater), Jerusalem (in cooperation with Al Bustan Association - Silwan) and Tulkarem (in cooperation with Dar

PC has also conducted trainings sessions in Gaza in cooperation with four local circus groups—Free Gaza Circus, Gaza Circus School, Gaza Stars Circus School, and Gaza School for Circus.




Number of children reached from West Bank and Gaza in the 3 - month specialized workshops in both semesters

Moon Group

The "Moon" annual group is intended for young individuals aged 10 to 14 who have received technical training from specialized workshops or summer camps.

As part of Moon group, our students facilitate joint workshops with their parents to discuss thematic issues that matters to them and develop an action plan and a performance that tackles the theme. This years theme was adaptation and coping mechanisms.





-----Female : n = 22



SOCIAL PROGRAM

Inhale Program

Our program is designed to support women who encounter cultural obstacles and difficulties, both internally and externally. Our focus is on empowering women by enhancing their physical, psychological, emotional, intellectual, and productive skills.

As part of CAPE (Creative Arts for Peace and Equality) project, and in collaboration with Clowns without Borders – Sweden, PCS trained 40 female students in the first semester and 39 female students in the second semester in Birzeit and Balata Camp.



Passion Program

At the Palestinian Circus, we believe social circus is a fundamental right for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Our program supports their personal, physical, and cognitive growth while offering a space for self-expression and energy release.

In 2024, ongoing political circumstances hindered our partnerships with the Arab Women Society and Al Awdeh Center, limiting us to working only with The Star Mountain Rehabilitation Center and Al Nahda Women Association. During the first semester, 30 children with disabilities participated in the program, followed by 26 in the second semester.



Despite all the challenges, our commitment remains strong in using circus arts to foster community understanding of individuals with intellectual disabilities and advocating for their social rights.

TRAINING OF TRAINERS PROGRAM

The Training of Trainers program forms a cornerstone of the Palestinian Circus, enabling the implementation of numerous programs and workshops, and helping reach as many target groups as possible across all regions to fulfilling the circus's vision of "Circus for All."



At the end of each year, the Palestinian Circus School provides its students with a chance to showcase their newly developed skills to their social circle. To achieve this, PCS arranges a range of open days across its various training locations. This year, PCS organized a total of 9 open days for all training groups, attracting over 930 individuals.

ARTISTIC CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

Masar

As part of the **DROSOS FOUNDATION** project "Circus Arts for Socio-Economic Development in Palestine", the 6-month Professional Circus Training program targets 10 young individuals per year, offering comprehensive training in various circus disciplines. Launched in **September 2024**, it currently engages 12 aspiring artists, empowering them with professional skills and contributing to the local circus arts scene.

In our efforts to showcase the Masar Artists, we launched the "Artist's Tale" video series, where they share their personal journeys. This initiative has enabled us to reach a broader audience and continue to inspire the youth generation, especially those of similar age to the artists.




ARTISTIC CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

Sun Group

Targeting youth (ages 18-14), the program enhances artistic and technical circus skills, emphasizing discipline, creativity, and proficiency. Participants engage in consistent training and workshops over two semesters, with intensive 4-hour weekly sessions to build abilities and prepare for careers in the circus industry.

Highlight: As part of this year's summer program, our students engaged in a series of training sessions that resulted in a facilitation workshop and a joint student-parent session held in partnership with Secours Catholique–Caritas France. A particularly exciting highlight was the students' production of an engaging circus performance.



ARTISTIC CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

Artistic Group

The Palestinian Circus has established a dedicated group to support the professional development of performing artists in Palestine. This group focuses on capacity-building initiatives, production support, and providing performance opportunities. Through these efforts, PC empowers artists, strengthens partnerships, and creates income-generating opportunities.



ARTISTIC GROUP ACTIVITIES

Artistic Village Summer Camp with Ashtar Theater

First Edition | 🕋 August 4-29, 2024 | 🥕 Palestine

Organized by the Palestinian Circus School in partnership with ASHTAR Theatre, the Artistic Village Camp brought together 16 young participants (8 male, 8 female), aged 21 to 35, for an intensive month of training. The program culminated in a powerful performance that combined both disciplines and was presented three times to the public.

EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS (ESC)

Through the European Solidarity Corps, the Palestinian Circus sends youth and artists to Europe for cultural exchange. This year, two artists—Aseel Ashour and Tala Younes—joined a year-long volunteer program in Germany.

ARTISTIC RESIDENCIES

Between July and December 2024, the Palestinian Circus engaged in both local and international artistic residencies. Highlights included the Sawa Sawa Project, in collaboration with the French Consulate. hosting Stereo 48's dance company summer camp, and sending Ihab Mutan for a one-month artistic residency in Italy in October 2024.

YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Circus ID – Second Edition | marginary 1 and 1 and 1 and 2 and 2

Circus ID united 45 young artists from Palestine and Belgium for three weeks of training, cultural exchange, and performances, reaching over 2,400 people and building lasting connections through circus arts.

This edition was made through the collaboration of **six Belgian circus schools**: Cirkus in Beweging, Circolito Circusatelier, Circus Zonder Handen, Cirqu' Conflex, École de Cirque de Bruxelles, and Circus Planeet, funded by Erasmus+ program.

Eileh A'al Takkeh

In collaboration with Red Noses in Palestine, The Palestinian Circus created Eileh A'al Takkeh, a unique show inspired by the challenges of Palestinian communities blending clowning, humor, and circus arts to bring joy and strengthen family bonds.

Originally directed by Paul Evans, Sarab explores the unpredictable journey toward an elusive goal. As we navigate challenges and obstacles, we reach a destination that feels nothing like we imagined—only to realize it was a mirage.



Reworked in 2024


In 2024, the Palestinian Circus reworked its theatrical performance Sarab under the direction of Mohammad Abu Taleb, featuring a new cast. The updated production continued to shed light on the global plight of refugees and was performed 8 times in France (supported by AGORA PNC – Boulazac), 2 times in Belgium (supported by École de Cirque de Bruxelles), and 3 times in Italy (supported by Gammazita).

Altogether, Sarab reached an audience of nearly 4,100 people through its local and international tour.



In 2024, PC delivered over **40** circus performances across Palestine and internationally, reaching more than **10,000** audience members. These shows engaged diverse communities.
