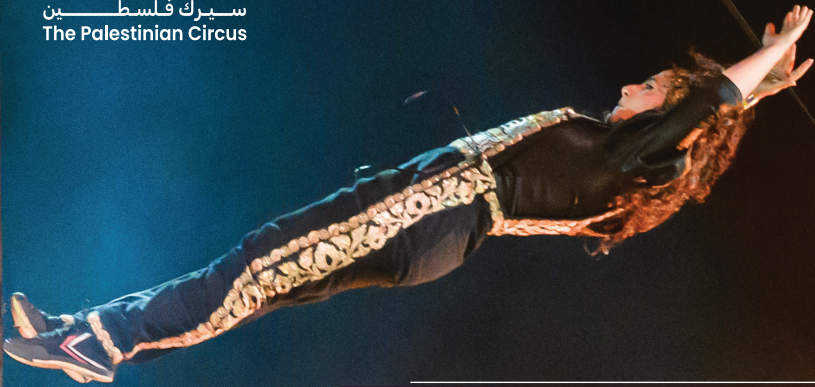

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

At The Palestinian Circus (PC), we remain committed to the concept of “Circus for All,” working towards an equitable and inclusive society where circus education is accessible to all Palestinians, regardless of background, gender, social status, or physical ability.

In 2025, The Palestinian Circus reached **4,506**, beneficiaries through its educational and social circus programming across Palestine.

CHILDHOOD PROGRAM

The Childhood Program provides structured circus training for children, focusing on physical development, creativity, teamwork, and self-confidence. In 2025, a total of **359** children benefited from long-term childhood circus training across PC locations.

3 - Month Specialized Workshops

The 7–5 years workshops trained **40** children (**18** females and **22** males). These workshops focused on foundational circus skills, creative movement, and playful exercises designed to support early physical and social development.

Moon Group

The Moon programs offers progressive circus training for older children and teens, building advanced technical skills, physical strength, and artistic expression.

Moon 1 (10–8 years) engaged **43** participants (**12** females and **31** males), with a focus on balance, teamwork, group performance, and basic aerial skills.

Moon 3+2 (14–8 years) reached **64** participants (**21** females and **43** males), providing more advanced aerial and acrobatic training tailored to experienced young learners.

Youth Exchanges:

In 2025, from July 27 to August 14, **14** young people participated in the **Bridges for Youth** program in Germany, including **7** males and **7** females, to explore advanced circus techniques and take part in collaborative performances.

Outreach

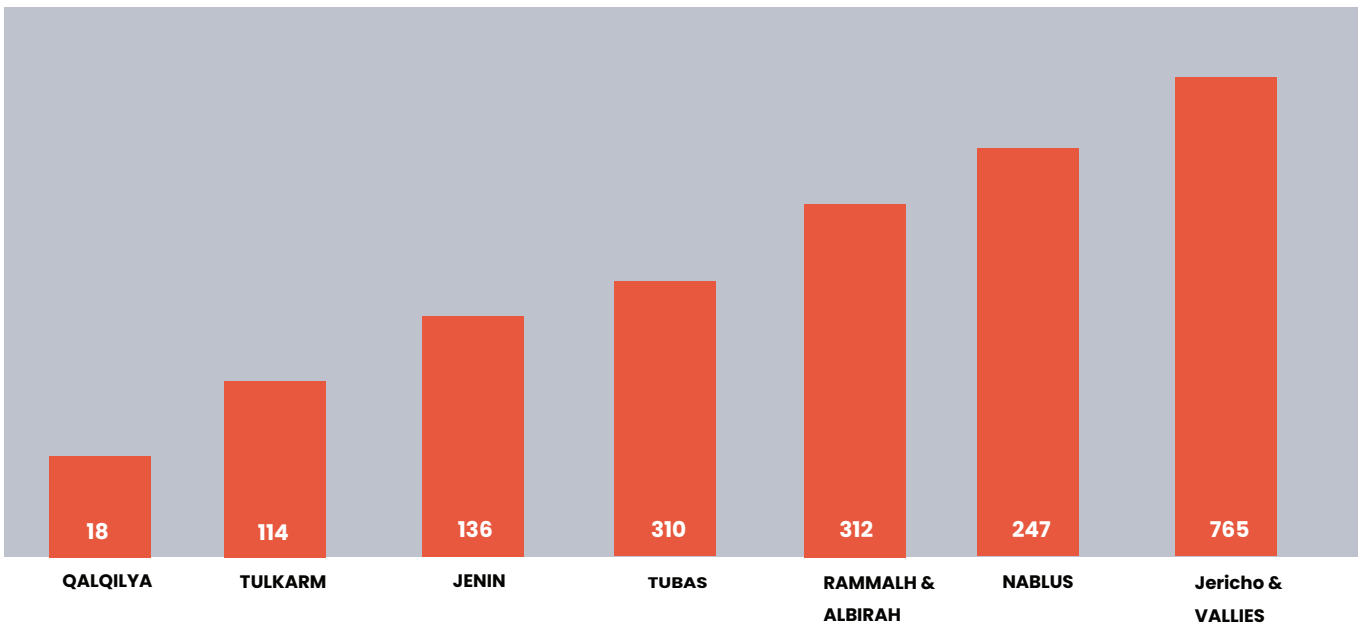
In 2025, through its Outreach Program, The Palestinian Circus partnered with Dar Qandeel, Al-Bustan Cultural Center, and The Freedom Theatre in Jenin to deliver circus sessions within local communities.

These sessions created accessible spaces for children and reached a total of **212** (**103** males, **109** females) in 2025.

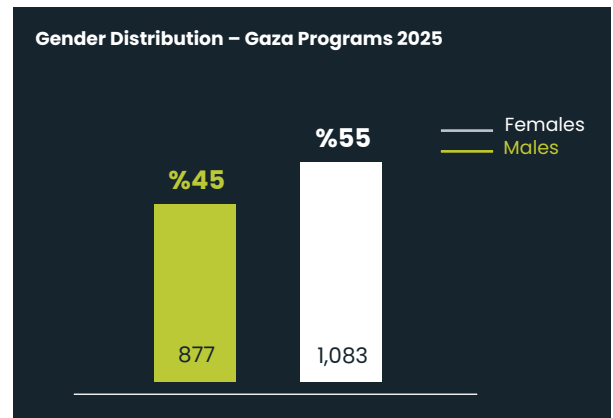
The Mobile Circus Program expanded access to circus education in underserved communities, schools, and community centers. In 2025, approximately **1,902** children participated in mobile circus activities, engaging in physical and creative exercises designed to foster inclusion and provide access to circus education in areas with limited resources.

In 2025, PC's Gaza programs reached a total of **1,960** participants, including **1,083** females and **877** males, through circus training and social circus activities, in partnership with, Free Gaza Circus Center, Gaza stars circus school, Gaza Circus School, Gaza Circus Team and Aisha Association.

SOCIAL PROGRAM

The Social Circus Program at The Palestinian Circus focuses on inclusion, participation, and community engagement among adolescents and youth from diverse backgrounds. In 2025, we reached a total of **132** beneficiaries from Inhale and Passion programs.

Inhale Program

Inhale is a social circus program designed to work primarily with women facing cultural and social challenges within their communities.

In 2025, the Social Program Inhale reached **82** participants in Betunia and Tulkarm through circus activities focused on coordination, acrobatics, and teamwork, engaging **45** participants in the first semester and **37** in the second, ensuring continuous youth participation throughout the year.

Passion Program

Passion is a social circus program for individuals with intellectual disabilities, affirming circus arts as a right and a space for artistic growth.

In 2025, the program reached participants through inclusive activities delivered in partnership with Star Mountain Association, Alnahda Women Association, Abnaona Association and Art to Heart. Participation grew from **48** in the first semester to **59** in the second, reflecting sustained engagement and expanding impact.

TRAINING OF TRAINERS PROGRAM

To strengthen local circus education, PC conducted Training of Trainers (ToT) programs focused on developing new trainers, enhancing technical and artistic skills, and promoting sustainable circus education. A total of **96** adults participated: **23** through the ToT Academy in February and **67** through the Ghiras Program in December, engaging in practical and artistic workshops, life skills development, and knowledge exchange with international circus networks.

Within this framework, Marah Program delivered a five-day intensive training in collaboration with **Red Noses** for **6** artists, equipping them with adapted artistic tools and practical approaches to work effectively with children with disabilities in rehabilitation centres.

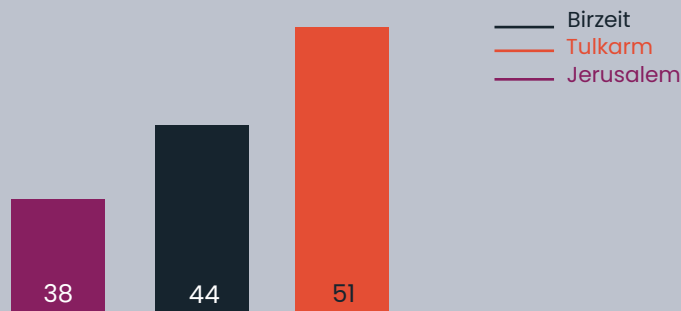
SUMMER CAMPS and OPEN DAYS

Each year, the Palestinian Circus organizes summer camps aimed at providing children and youth with a safe and creative space to develop their circus skills, build confidence, strengthen teamwork, and express themselves artistically during the summer break.

In 2025, the camps were implemented in Birzeit, Tulkarem, and Jerusalem, in partnership with Dar Qandeel and Al Bustan Association , reaching a total of **133** students (**38** males and **95** females). The program concluded with open days that allowed participants to share their progress with families and communities, reinforcing community engagement and celebrating their artistic growth.

Advanced Professional Training Programs *Within Circus Arts for Social & Economic Development in Palestine.*

Masar 1

Sept 2024 – May 2025

Graduation & Solo Performances:

A six-month transformative journey for 12 artists, refining their artistic identity and professional pathways, culminating in original solo works in 2026.

Masar 2

Launched in Late September 2025

A new generation steps into the path; 11 artists advancing technical mastery, refining artistic voice, and shaping the future of contemporary circus in Palestine.

SUN Group | Youth Pre-Professional Track

Sept 2025 – May 2026

Youth (14–18), 16 participants engaged in structured weekly training to strengthen technique, discipline, and creative expression.

Youth Exchanges & Summer Camps:

In 2025, Palestinian artists took part in international exchanges with our partners: Sorin Sirkus in Finland (10 participants), Ton Sur Ton in Switzerland (12 participants), and Masifunde in South Africa (6 participants). Locally, the Sun Group Summer Camp fostered artistic growth and skill development.



Where Art Meets Impact

Two productions. Global visibility. Local transformation.

The Wonderland

Created for Palestinian children, *The Wonderland* inspires, empowers, and sparks imagination through circus arts. Presented 16 times locally only with more demand, it reached children and families where its needed most, in Palestine. Developed with **Incandescence Circus** in Spain, it also launched an international fundraising campaign to expand its reach in 2026.

Step & A Half – Palestinian Voices on the Global Stage

In 2025, Palestinian artists took the stage at one of the world’s most iconic festivals, a landmark moment for our contemporary circus movement, despite immense challenges, political uncertainty that led to last-minute travel arrangements and nearly preventing participation.

Knowing the power of this global platform, our artists remained determined: to amplify Palestinian voices and to turn this proud moment into meaningful visibility.

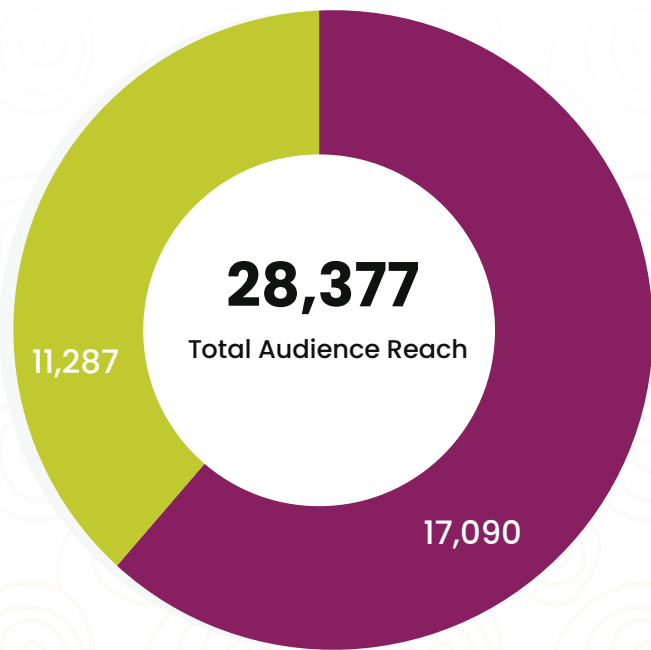
Impact Through Performances

28,377 Members Reached

In 2025, our performances reached further than ever; across cities, villages, schools, and stages around the world.

Through **103** shows, our artists brought circus arts to children and communities, creating moments of joy, wonder, and learning, while ensuring access for audiences everywhere.

International tours amplified Palestinian stories, fostered cross-cultural connections, and strengthened partnerships, showcasing the resilience, creativity, and talent of our artists on a global stage.

International Touring

SARAB

SARAB, our tragic theatrical circus, tells the story of refugees: their struggles, dreams, and aspirations through movement, theatre, and circus artistry. In 2025, the show reached international audiences thanks to our partners: PAC and Friends of the Palestinian Circus for the Belgium tour, Doulab for Circus and Dance for the Ireland tour, and FEDEC for France at the CIRCA Festival. SARAB also performed at the Sabir Festival in Palermo, Italy.

Through these performances, our youth artists transformed every stage into moments of empathy, reflection, and hope, reaching a total audience of **8,170** and creating spaces where resilience, imagination, and community meet.

Impact Through Developing Artistic Excellence

Expanding Skills & Horizons

Workshops & Intensives

Strengthened skills, creativity, and collaboration through four intensive programs:

Artistic Exploration – drama, movement, and contemporary circus techniques.

Teeterboard Intensive – balance, trust, and partner acrobatics.

Aerial Training – introduction to Tissue (Silk) and Trapeze.

Acro-Dance Intensive – floor work, balance, and partnering.

Delivered with guidance from international experts from France and Belgium.

ESC / EVS Placements

Four artists gained professional and cross-cultural experience through European Solidarity Corps (ESC/EVS) placements in Germany and Belgium, strengthening networks and advancing their artistic practice.

International Artistic Residency

Within the framework of the SAWA SAWA program—an initiative supporting Palestinian artists across disciplines—the French Consulate supported a residency for artist Wajdi Khalid at Agora PNC in France, fostering international collaboration and artistic development.
